


From the emptiness in the mouth. The sound of letter Alif and Hamza identical.









From the moist part of the lips. Baa, Meem and Waaw are pronounced from same place in mouth





Tip of the tongue touching the gums of the upper two front teeth (Thanaaya Ulya). • • are pronounced from same place.












Middle of the throat. This is part of Letters of Halq





Letter Khaa is pronounced from the closest part of the throat (nearest to the mouth). This is part of Letters of Adnal Halq






These letters are pronounced with the tip of the tongue touching the edge of the Thanaaya Sufla (lower two front teeth), and lightly touching the upper two front teeth as well. These letters are known as Huroofus Safier because of the whistling sound produced when saying them.


Hamza Haa ເ≽ ເຊື

These are pronounced from the Ahsal Halq, the bottom of the throat near the chest.





This letter is pronounced with the raising of the back end of the tongue and touching the soft palate.



Letter Kaaf is emitted away from the back end of the tongue with corresponding part of the hard palate, a little nearer toward the front of the mouth.








Letter Daad is pronounced when up turned side or sides of the tongue touches the upper back teeth (pre-molars)







Letter Laam is pronounced when the tip of the tongue together with any one side, while being raised toward the plalate touches the gums from the upper two front teeth.






Letter Nun is pronounced when the tip of the tongue only touch the gums of the lateral incisors and canines (but will not touch the first molars)






Letter Raa is pronounced from the sides of the tongue up to the end will touch the gums of the molars.





Letter Faa is pronounced when the inner portion of the lower lips meets the edge of the upper central incisors.
